About the Talk:

"Doctrine, Poetry, and Ritual: Did Aśvaghoṣa Author the *Tridaṇḍamālā*?" On his third expedition to Tibet in 1938, Rāhula Sāṃkṛtyāyana saw a manuscript, which contained a text with the unusual title *Tridaṇḍamālā*. Only one year later, Giuseppe Tucci was able to photograph the manuscript. In its colophon, the work was attributed to the famous Buddhist poet Aśvaghoṣa, but scholars questioned this ascription and the text remained unstudied. Recent research, however, has revealed an amazing plethora of connections with this very Aśvaghoṣa. The lecture will introduce these connections and discuss the purpose of the text.
