**Online Entrance Exam for MA (French) / MA (German)/ MA (Russian)
/ MA (Spanish)/MA (Japanese)**

Topics Covered

Section A : Common to all 5 languages, questions will be in English.

- 20 questions of 1 marks each (**Total 20 marks**)

Topics : literature and culture ; problem solving ability ; language skills (synonym, antonym, meaning of a phrase etc.)

Section B : Language specific questions (Total 80 marks)

- All Multiple Choice Questions with 4 options
- There will be 40 questions of 2 marks each
- For each correct answer -- 2 marks
- For each incorrect answer – 25% marks cut

[e.g. Section A : 14 correct answers – 14 marks; 6 incorrect answers – 1.5 marks deducted.

$$14 - 1.5 = 12.5$$

Section B : 28 correct answers : 56 marks, 12 wrong answers : 3 marks deducted.

$$56 - 3 = 53$$

Final score : $12.5 + 53 = 65.5/100]$

- Time : 2 hours for all 100 marks (20 + 80)
- Seats : MA French 30; MA German 30; MA Russian 10; MA Spanish 20; MA Japanese 20.
- No cut off.
 - First OEE results will be announced.
 - Merit list of all candidates who appeared will be prepared as per social reservations and any other rule if applicable.
 - The merit list notice will give further instructions about confirming admission, last date etc.
- Eligibility : We expect you to see the eligibility Annexure A on CCEP portal while filling up the form. The same is reproduced here along with syllabus

Provisional admission when qualifying exam has not taken place is understandable, but not having attended any of the qualifying course will disqualify the candidate even if there are vacant seats.

Topic-wise Weightage and Syllabus

B1 – 20 Questions ; B2 – 10 Questions ; B3 – 5 Questions ; B4 – 5 Questions

Syllabus :

B1 : Grammar – all the 6 cases in singular and plural, adjective declensions in all the cases, verbs of motion with prefixes, verbs of definite and indefinite motion, perfective and imperfective aspect of verbs, participles (active and passive, past and present), gerunds, comparative and superlative degree, direct and indirect speech.

B2 : Language Skills – Semantics of prefixed verbs, synonyms, antonyms, phrases

B3 : Text based questions – Objective questions based on the texts from the textbook “Russian for English speakers” V.N. Wagner, Y.G. Ovsienko

B4 : Literature and Culture – Writers and their works, History and Geography of Russia, important historical events like the abolition of serfdom, the Decembrist revolt, the 1917 revolution etc., important cultural figures like film makers, painters, musicians etc.

Advanced Diploma in Spanish of SPPU with min 60% marks <u>or</u>
B2 level exam of Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (Spanish) passed
OR BA with Spanish of any other University

TOPIC-WISE SYLLABUS

The distribution of the content according to topics is as below:

Out of a total of 40 questions,

Grammar: 24 questions

History, society, politics, culture, geography: 8 questions

Literature, cinema, art: 8 questions

SYLLABUS FOR EACH PART

Grammar:

- All verb tenses and forms up to level B2, including but not limited to, present, past, future, conditional indicative, present, past subjunctive, imperative – all in simple and compound forms as applicable
- Connectors, prepositions, conjunctions up to level B2
- Ser and estar
- Parts of speech: nouns, pronouns, object pronouns, adjectives, adverbs, etc.
- Vocabulary up to level B2
- Idioms and proverbs

History, society, politics, culture, geography:

- For Spain as well as Latin America during the period from 15th century to the 20th century

Literature, cinema, art:

- For Spain as well as Latin America during the period from 15th century to the 20th century

Eligibility : Graduation in any subject of any faculty

PLUS

Advanced Diploma in Japanese of SPPU with min 60% marks

or

JLPT N3 level exam of Japan Foundation passed

OR

BA with Japanese of any other University

TOPICS OF THE OEE SYLLABUS

Section B : Language specific questions (Total 40 questions, 80 marks)

SYLLABUS FOR EACH TOPIC

- All grammar forms, grammar expressions (文型表現) and their usage up to JLPT N3 level
- Parts of speech: nouns, pronouns, adjectives, adverbs, verbs etc.
- Vocabulary up to JLPT N3 level
- Kanji to JLPT N3 level
- Idioms and set expressions

2. 読解 (Comprehension)

- Questions to check comprehension of long passages on macro and micro level
- Questions to check comprehension of short passages

3. 日本事情・歴史と文化 (History, geography, society, culture)

- Basic facts about the history and geography of Japan
- Characteristics of Japanese society and culture

4. 翻訳・ビジネス日本語(Translation and Business Japanese)

- Questions checking basic skills of Translation (Japanese to English)
- Basic Business/office Japanese expressions
