Introduction and the theme:

"Participation and attention to members and a community focus are key points that have guided cooperatives' actions in recent months. These actions could be the pillars for disseminating a business model that embraces the goals promoted by the 2030 Agenda in terms of human rights, fair labour, environmental sustainability, and sustainable growth."-The World Cooperative Monitor.

Cooperatives are found Globally, in every state and in every nation and cover all facets of human life, to name just a few, from agriculture and finance to housing. Cooperatives meet needs that are currently not being met in the marketplace, from quality products and services to better prices and outstanding customer service. A cooperative is a business model that can offer opportunities to people of all ages.

The economic contribution of cooperatives is often undervalued and sometimes ignored. The annual turnover of the 300 top cooperatives throughout the globe is around 2.3 Trillion USD which make it around 6th or 7th largest global economy. Further, the Indian cooperative movement is the largest in the world, representing almost 24 crore members and over 8 lakh cooperatives from village to national level and is functioning through important sectors like credit, fertilizers, dairy, fisheries and practically every aspect of production in the nation.

Globe is emerging out from the Covid19 pandemic issues as wellthere are underlined issues like Growing Inequality, Environmental Degradation and Increasing Unemployment. It is a time when things that were previously unimaginable are now a reality. The mandatory shutdowns of non-essential businesses and the confinement of billions of people to their homes, are revamping societies and economies. The impact is unevenly distributed for households, workers and businesses, further exacerbating inequalities that already exist. As experienced in past economic and social crises one can expect a new wave of interest in cooperatives due to people will seek a different way to organize the economy and society.

The cooperative movement can be criticised, but there are two facts that are particularly relevant today: Cooperatives are resilient organizations and cooperatives grow in difficult times. Despite various difficulties, cooperatives are demonstrating their ability to reorganize themselves, to reinvent themselves and to grow. Indeed, difficult times await us. Many of our cooperatives are suffering the consequences of an economic slowdown, while others are at risk of closure and uncertainty for their future. The need for a community-based economic model is vital in these moments. A model that serves its people, its communities and finds its strength in the support of those very same people and communities is the need of the hour.

In the words of the Honourable Prime MinisterShri Narendra Modiji, "The Cooperative movement is such a model which can provide a successful alternative to socialism and capitalism". The village-based economy, internal demand driven growth, local communities coming together as producers –as envisaged by Mahatma Gandhi. Today, all these 'theories' are looking back at us as the only viable options for sustainable and meaningful growth and they all lead us to cooperative institutions.

Despite the difficulties, cooperatives are demonstrating their ability to reorganize themselves, to reinvent themselves and to cooperate. But at the same time, the cooperative model of serving the people and its community had gain some strength and opportunity during the covid-19. With the hold

on import of agriculture commodities, Farmers' cooperative society i.e. FPO and FPC can take an advantage of bringing out the local produce to the people door steps. Huge package from the central Government to impose the tag Made- in-India, can strive the opportunities for manufacturing unit along with handicraft society. Keeping in economic condition of middle class family, they try to spend most on the basic necessity needs like cereal, milk, fruits and vegetables, which leads to a surplus demand for the producer cooperatives.

Currently, youth are under distress and confused about their career and future prospects. Youth are involved in the cooperative movement, either as member-owners, as employees or as recipients of cooperative education. When one speaks about youth entrepreneurship, three words are most important such as youth in cooperatives, empowerment and freedom of choice. By combining of all, the virtual cycle of engagement is created. The need for adoption of technology also much important with youth engagement and they are interested in technology.

With the backdrop of structural change in the Cooperatives, new avatar of Credit Cooperatives, youth involvement in cooperatives and the business opportunities for cooperatives the Research Conference is planned. The broad areas of the 36thISSCAnnual Research National Convention are need and impact of structural change in the cooperatives, short term cooperative credit structures, new technological and business model, youth participation in cooperatives and above all the strengthening of Cooperatives.

Keeping the above aspects, the 36th Annual National Research Conference aims to address a wide range of topics for cooperatives. In which, the specific areas for discussion are,

The details of paper submission and formats are as follows:

1. Abstracts

Researchers interested to present their papers in the Conference need to submit an abstract of not more than 600 words in Times New Roman, single spacing, 12 Fonts, Normal letters. The title should be in Times New Roman, 14 Fonts, and Bold. It should broadly include the research question, methodology, likely contribution to the field of knowledge and relevant literature. The keywords should contain 4-10 words. Send the abstract to ISSC, Pune by email at the following address: isscpune@yahoo.co.in The abstracts should be submitted in the following format:

- Title of paper
- Name(s) and affiliations of Authors
- Main theme/ objective of the paper
- Methodological and/or Conceptual approach
- Bibliography, Keywords and Contact details.

2. Full paper publication

All submissions must be original and may not be under review by another Publication. Selected papers will be published as book chapters in an edited book with ISBN number. The full paper should be limited to 6000 words in Times New Roman, single spacing, 12 Fonts, Normal letters. The title should be in Times New Roman, 14 Fonts, and Bold. The paper should be preferably based on primary data collection/case studies. Length of papers generally of six to eight pages in A-4size. It should be sent in hard and soft copy.

3. Paper Presentation

The mode of presentation, online and offline, need to be intimated after the acceptance of the paper. Best papers will be felicitated in the next (37thANRC) conference. There will be no separate registration for paper presentations.
